

Strengthen and Grow Child Care Grant:
Funding Philosophy

Strengthen and Grow Child Care Grants (SGCC) What's it all about?

The Strengthen and Grow Child Care Grant (SGCC) is a childcare program funded by the Illinois Department of Human Services' (IDHS) Division of Early Childhood (DEC) and administered by the Illinois Network of Child Care Resource and Referral Agencies (INCCRRA).

SGCC is stemmed by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Child Care Stabilization Funds. Governor Pritzker has dedicated \$300 million in ARPA Child Care Stabilization Funds to this grant program.

Designed to provide stable, predictable funding to support high-quality childcare and invest in our critical childcare workforce.

The Strengthen and Grow Child Care Grant program launched in January 2022; the program will start in February 2022 and run through January 2023.

Applications for the Round 3 quarter will open in June, date TBA.

Grant application portal for Round 3 will remain open for 3 weeks

Strengthen and Grow Child Care Grants: Funding Philosophy

- To align with the Early Childhood Funding Commission's recommendations.
- Take all funding streams into account
- Prioritize equitable and transparent funding across all of Illinois
- Recognizes that programs without predictable funding struggle
- In alignment with what the Funding Commission heard from the field
- As recommended by the Funding Commission, the State can no longer make investments in early childhood one funding stream at a time, but rather must take all sources of programs' funding into consideration.

Quarters

SGCC Round 1: February – April 2022

SGCC Round 2: May – July 2022

SGCC Round 3: August – October 2022 (Applications available: May 31st – June 17th)

SGCC Round 4: November – January 2023 (Applications available in September)

Funding

Updates/notifications will be emailed.

For rounds 2, 3, and 4 programs should receive payments the month before the grant period begins.

Example: Round 3 grant checks should mail in July.



Reporting

Quarterly reporting is due on the 15th of the month following the quarter.






the Where to Start ...

Is Your Center Eligible?

- Currently licensed in IL as a childcare center, childcare home, or group care home
- In operation as of March 2021 and still operating now
- Operate full-day and full-year
- Currently participate in the Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) – 10% program enrollment
- Receive **no more than 50%** of total early childhood program / site revenue from Early Childhood Block Grant funding
- Complete Eligibility: SGCC Attestation Form

If the final number in the box is greater than 10%, your site meets this SGCC eligibility criteria. Since the final number is greater than 10% - it is 25% - this program is eligible to apply.

How do I know if I met the 10% CCAP requirement?

Programs can meet the 10% CCAP enrollment eligibility criteria using monthly CCAP enrollment from any month from January 2020 until today. You can determine your program's eligibility using the following tool for each site that you are applying for.



- Quarterly Budget
- ☐ A DUNs number
- □ Completed W9
- Attestation Round 3 (link not available yet)
- Illinois Secretary of State <u>Certificate of Good Standing</u>
- Bank Statement (for Payment Detail Page)

PRO TIP: Keep files separate when uploading and label the files appropriately. EX: ABC Childcare W9. The reviewer will have an easier time looking at your documents AND the files won't be too large.

the Funding Amounts

How much will my programs qualify for?

Family Child Care Homes	\$2,500 per program / per QTR (\$10,000 per program / YR)
Group Family Child Care Homes	\$3,750 per program / per QTR (\$15,000 per program / YR)
Child Care Centers	\$6,250 per program / per QTR (\$25,000 per program / YR)

- When approved, all programs will receive at least a base amount of funding. (see above)
- Applicants will receive an estimated SGCC <u>quarterly</u> grant award amount.
- Required to submit a budget describing how they will spend that award amount during that quarter.
- If your program is in a census tract with a Social Vulnerability Index (SVI) of 0.5 or above, you will receive an additional amount.


Quarterly SGCC Grant Award by SVI Score

- ☐Additional funding may be available depending on your census tract.
- □ Check if your program is in a census tract with <u>Social Vulnerability Index</u> using the interactive <u>map</u>.
- □Click anywhere on the map around your location to bring up a box that will list your overall SVI score. Use this score to find your funding amount below

How should this money be used?

Investments in the workforce (50%)

- Increases in wages and benefits or other areas of compensation:
 - Staff bonuses
 - Health, dental, and vision insurance
 - Scholarships
 - Paid sick or family leave
 - Retirement contributions
 - Ongoing professional development or training
 - Mental health consultations for staff, other types of mental health supports to staff
 - Employee transportation costs to or from work
- Support for staff in accessing COVID-19 vaccines, including paid time off for vaccine appointments & managing side effects, and transportation costs to vaccine appointments
- Recruitment and retention of staff

You can find the complete list for the grant program ON THE TIPSHEET.

Eligible Expenses (50%)

- Equipment, including, personal Protective Equipment and other supplies to promote health and safety
- Cleaning and sanitation supplies and services
- Training and professional development related to health and safety practices
- Equipment, supplies, services, and training that support meeting state and local health and safety guidelines;
- Purchases of or updates to equipment and supplies to respond to the COVID-19
- Public health emergency, including technological upgrades that programs can use to collect and report data
- Rent or mortgage payments, utilities, facilities maintenance, etc.
- Mental health services, including infant and early childhood mental health consultation
- Program funds <u>CANNOT</u> be used for major renovations or major facilities improvements



- Once your budget request has been submitted, it cannot be edited. If you would like to review your request in read-only mode, click the magnifying glass icon.

Once you have completed your application ...

INCCRRA will email you to let you know"

- If your application is incomplete or clearer documentation needs to be uploaded.
- If you need to submit clearer documentation, you will be allowed time to submit additional documentation.
- If your application has been found eligible or ineligible.
- When your grant payment has been mailed.
- First round SGCC checks will begin mailing in early February.
- If your application is eligible, and you receive an email with a date your check is mailed, please allow 30 days to receive the check.



PRE-VENTURE STAGE

0 - 6 MOS in business, no consistent revenue

Loan Amounts: \$1,000 up to \$15,000

Terms: 3 mos - 3 years Interest Rates: 8.5-9%

START-UP

6 MOS - 2 years in business, proven revenue stream

Loan Amounts: \$1,000 to \$25,000

Terms: 3 mos - 4 years Interest Rates: 8-9%

Note: final terms are based on amounts and business stage.

DOCUMENTATION

- Personal Tax Returns
- Business Plan
- Income Statement / Proft & Loss Statement
- Balance Sheet
- Collateral is required
- Business Owner's ID
- Business License
- 1 year projections are required (i.e. cash flow statement)

Supplemental documentation may be requested based on the age of the business.

ESTABLISHED

6 MOS - 2+ years in business,

consistent revenue

Loan Amounts: \$1,000 to \$50,000

Terms: 3 mos - 4 years Interest Rates: 7-9%
